The Dickinson State University Department of Agriculture and Technical Studies is seeking an innovative and energetic individual for a tenure-track faculty position in agriculture. Teaching responsibilities will include undergraduate coursework in agribusiness and farm management. Additional teaching responsibilities may include plant sciences or natural resource management. Expertise and experience in the application of GIS and remote sensing technologies to agriculture, business, and/or natural resource management is preferred. In addition to teaching responsibilities, the successful candidate will be expected to provide quality academic advising service to students, participate in departmental and University committees, engage in research and other professional development activities, participate in program development, revision, and assessment activities, work collaboratively with others within the institution, and participate in cooperative efforts to provide technical assistance to the agricultural community in the region. An earned doctorate in agriculture or related field is required. All degrees must be from a regionally accredited institution. College teaching experience and demonstrated ability to integrate technology in educational settings preferred. Women and culturally diverse candidates are invited and encouraged to apply for this position.

This is a nine-month, tenure track faculty position. The salary is competitive with an attractive benefit package, including TIAA-CREF retirement and Blue Cross/Blue Shield health insurance. Appointment date is August 16, 2008.
