

PHD AND MS FELLOWSHIPS IN BIOSECURITY IN THE AGRIBUSINESS AND FOOD SUPPLY CHAIN

Available beginning Fall 2007

USDA National Needs Fellowships are available for students enrolling in the Texas A&M Department of Agricultural Economics. These fellowships are available only to U.S. citizens and resident aliens. Fellows will focus on homeland security-related economics of decisions regarding surveillance, detection, protection, response and recovery as they relate to biosecurity management, policy, vulnerability, quality, safety, assurance, traceability, risk management and liability in the agribusiness and food supply chain.

The Department of Agricultural Economics has strong synergies with the Foreign Animal Disease Defense Center, the Spatial Science Laboratory, the Supply Chain Systems Laboratory, the Department of Food Science and Technology, the School of Veterinary Medicine, and the Mays Business School.

Fellows will build competencies in an interdisciplinary setting to support careers involved with management policy and regulatory processes in state/federal agencies, corporate management, or in leading academic programs.

Funding levels for the **USDA National Needs Fellows** will be as follows:

PhD - \$24,000/year for a maximum of 3 years

MS - \$18,000/year for a maximum of 2 years
