The Department of Rural Economy, Faculty of Agricultural, Life and Environmental Sciences, invites applications from outstanding individuals for one full-time, tenured position at the Professor level. As a result of our current directions in undergraduate and graduate programs, and to build on areas of research strength, we are interested in high quality candidates with research expertise applied to Environmental Economics topics including land use, water resources, air quality, environment and health or other environmental and resource issues in a global or local context. The successful candidate will be required to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels, supervise undergraduate and graduate students, establish a viable, externally-funded research program, and assist in the administrative duties of the department and faculty. This position is at the Full Professor level but outstanding candidates at other levels may be considered. Candidates should have outstanding research, graduate student supervision and teaching records required for appointment at the CRC Tier I level. Applicants should hold an earned Ph.D. in economics or related field, with environmental economics as a specialization, and will have made significant contributions in major economic journals and public policy fora, to research on environmental economics.
